

### CHURCH LETTER

#### Dear Friends

I wrote last month of the season of Lent being a period of selfexamination. Whatever is going on in our private lives, it seems there is much to reflect on in the world around us. There is the coronavirus contagion that dominates the news headlines at every term and the tightening guidelines to help stop its spread throughout our nation and of course the world. As I write, I am just beginning to hear of people selecting to self-isolate in response to guidance being given. By the time you read this, I expect there will be more stringent measures being advised.

At a more local level, there has been the tragic death of Val Jozunas from our village. The circumstances of her death has not been detailed and perhaps some supposition has filled in the gaps for the news that has been spreading around the village. What is certain though is that it is a tragedy for the whole family leaving many in the community bewildered. It was good to have a small number from the village join us for our prayer group early in March reflecting on and praying for those affected by this tragic event. A bible reading I used at a Sunday service recently was John 9:1-12. It is the story of a man born blind being healed by Jesus. The religious leaders looking on seemed more interested in what the 'sin' was that caused the blindness and where the authority of Jesus to heal came from, rather than the miracle of restored sight itself.

This is a good message for us too. Sometimes, we are like the religious leaders and can be too focused on the cause of the problem - the 'why has this happened?' question. Whereas we should be more focused on our response – the 'what shall I do, how should I respond?' question, which of course is what Jesus focuses on and brings healing to the man.

I certainly haven't got answers to all the why questions we may have and I suggest people of any faith with integrity would never claim to have them. However, in faith I can claim the hope we have in the message of Easter – that even the darkness of death can be overcome with resurrection new life in Jesus. In the face of the coronavirus and a tragic death, I find Jesus gives comfort, peace and the possibility of new beginnings in a sometimes-bewildering world.

I wish you all the happiness and hope of Easter and the opportunity of new life through the resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. Easter Blessings



### 3 April - Richard of Chichester - more clearly, dearly and nearly

Ever wonder where the prayer ... '*May I know thee more clearly, love thee more dearly, and follow thee more nearly, day by day*' comes from? Richard of Chichester, a bishop in the 13th century, wrote it.

He began life as Richard de Wych of Droitwich, the son of a yeoman farmer. But Richard was a studious boy, and after helping his father on the farm for several years, refused an advantageous offer of marriage, and instead made his way to Oxford, and later to Paris and Bologna to study canon law.


In 1235 he returned to Oxford, and was soon appointed Chancellor, where he supported Edmund, Archbishop of Canterbury, in his struggles against King Henry III's misuse of Church funds. After further study to become a priest, Richard was in due course made a bishop himself. He was greatly loved. He was charitable and accessible, both stern and merciful to sinners, extraordinarily generous to those stricken by famine, and a brilliant legislator of his diocese. He decreed that the sacraments were to be administered without payment, Mass celebrated in dignified conditions, the clergy to be chaste, to practise residence, and to wear clerical dress. The laity was obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days, and to know by heart the Hail Mary as well as the Lord's Prayer and the Creed.

Richard was also prominent in preaching the Crusade, which he saw as a call to reopen the Holy Land to pilgrims, not as a political expedition. He died at Dover on 3 April 1253.

In art, Richard of Chichester is represented with a chalice at his feet, in memory of his having once dropped the chalice at Mass! One ancient English church is dedicated to him.

And, of course, he is author of that famous prayer, now set to popular music :

Thanks be to thee, my Lord Jesus Christ For all the benefits thou hast given me, For all the pains and insults which thou hast borne for me. O most merciful redeemer, friend and brother, May I know thee more clearly, love thee more dearly And follow thee more nearly, day by day.
